

# North Valley Symphony Orchestra 2016-17 Annual Report



**The Mission** of NVSO is to provide skilled and aspiring musicians of all ages the opportunity to learn, rehearse, and perform exceptional orchestral music, fostering music appreciation and engagement among members of the North Valley community.

**Our vision** is to be a vibrant and diverse community that deeply cares for the artistry, learning and performance of exceptional orchestral music.

## **BOARD MESSAGE**

The North Valley Symphony (NVSO) Board of Directors meets annually in late spring or early summer to review the previous year's accomplishments, and to establish goals for the upcoming concert year. This year's annual strategy meeting was held June 10, 2017. The Board of Directors invited Matt Lehrman, a professional strategic planner, to join this meeting.

# **Accomplishments:**

NVSO continues to gain more awareness in the community as we increase the quality of our performances. Attendance remained comparable to previous years, with a decrease at the "Santa Claus Symphony" holiday concert over the previous year's "Pops for the Holidays" concert. The May "Back to the Movies" concert drew about 200 people more than the previous year's "American Freedoms" concert.

NVSO continued to provide outreach groups for various community events, including mall performances, Paradise Valley Community College's Beatles show, non-profit fundraisers, and graduation ceremonies. These performance opportunities raise awareness of NVSO in the community we serve. The number of outreach performances dropped from previous years, and the renewal of Outreach programs has become a goal for the 2017-18 season.

NVSO was able to contribute \$5,000 to the reserve fund, successfully meeting the 5year goal to raise \$25,000 for the reserve fund.

NVSO has maintained a strong relationship with Paradise Valley Unified School District and the North Phoenix Chamber of Commerce.

The Board of Directors voted to hire contractors to serve as directors for the Symphonettes and Youth Orchestra for the Spring Semester. Applicants were interviewed and auditioned and the positions were offered to Caitlin Corbett and Joshua Lynch. In addition, the Board voted to move forward with plans to add a third youth ensemble, Youth Strings, to be launched in Fall 2017. Orlando Moss was contracted to be the director of the new ensemble.

#### **Orchestra Membership:**

# Meeting 2016-17 Goals:

The Board of Directors met on June 12, 2016 to lay out goals for the 2016-17 season. These goals were established based on one over-arching premise: NVSO will never go into the "red" but will always have a balanced budget, and stay within our budget year to year.

Accomplishments against goals for the 2016-17 season:

- Goal: \$5,000 transfer to Reserve Fund This goal was achieved, reaching the final goal of \$25,000 set aside in the first 5 years of NVSO.
- Goal: Purchase of Percussion maintain budget to purchase if needed Funding is in place to purchase if necessary, but we continue to be able to use the equipment at North Canyon H.S. so no purchases have been made.
- Goal: Staffing Hire a Grant Writer on commission: Not achieved. Grant applications were written by board members

Hire an Executive Director by May 2018: In progress. The job description and title will be written and job posted during the 2017-18 season.

Pay Music Director by May 2019: Achieved. The Board voted to start paying the music director as a contractor during the 2017-18 season.

Pay Youth Ensemble Directors: Achieved. Symphonettes and Youth Orchestra directors were paid starting in the Spring semester of the 2016-17 season, and the new Youth Strings ensemble director was added starting in Fall 2017-18.

# Goal: Grant Applications

2016-17 Submit 4 applications totaling \$4,000 - Not achieved. Grant funds were received from Arizona Commission on the Arts for \$2,000.

2017-18 Submit 4 applications totaling \$7,000 – In process, partially achieved. Grant applications were submitted to several organizations. Grant funds were received from the Arizona Commission on the Arts for \$5,000 and the City of Phoenix Office of Arts And Culture for \$5,000 for at total of \$10,000. Additional applications are in process.

- Reduction of Adult Stand Fees-Reduce fee to \$60 for 2016-17 season Goal Achieved- Stand fees for 2016-17 were \$60. Fees were further reduced for the 2017-18 season to \$40.
- Concert Sponsorships: Obtain 4 concert sponsors, totaling \$4,000 Not achieved. We had sponsors for 3 out of 4 concerts. We did not have a sponsor for the March concert.
- Fundraising Goal: \$5,000 (\$2000 from outreach and \$3,000 from fundraising)

Overall goal was achieved by the addition of a Silent Auction fundraiser to the fundraising gala and raffle ticket sales at the May concert. The outreach goal was not obtained, but was made up by having nearly \$8,500 in proceeds from the Silent Auction and raffles.

## Individual Donor Goal: 2016-17 - \$15,000

This donation was nearly achieved with a total of \$14,920.86. At the May concert we had a specific campaign to raise funds to purchase music stands to accommodate our addition of a third youth orchestra. Our goal was to receive donations to purchase 6 stands at \$60 per stand. We received the funds to purchase 9 at the concert and an additional donation later in the summer.

# Repertoire Sponsorship Goal - \$100 per piece

This goal was not achieved. We received repertoire sponsorships for 2 pieces during the 2016-17 season, totaling \$185. The sponsorship covers the exact cost to purchase a specific piece of music. Donor names are listed in the concert program as a repertoire sponsor. Further publicity of this sponsorship opportunity is planned for the 2017-18 season.

## MUSIC DIRECTOR STATEMENT

This last concert season NVSO as a whole achieved a new level of artistic maturity.

The season began with an audition process involving exceptional current NVSO adult members that had the desire and dream to perform concertos on their primary instruments. Community musicians do not frequently enjoy the opportunity to demonstrate their musical talents in this way, and I am proud that NVSO has offered our best musicians this program.

The result of the auditions led to three of our principal musicians performing during the concert season. In the "Three B's: Bach, Beethoven and Brahms" concert, Jessica and Craig Triplett performed Bach's Brandenburg Concerto No. 6 for two violas. This piece is incredibly difficult, and the Triplett's performance set a high bar for the remainder of the NVSO concert season. Additionally, Philip Johnson performed the Franz Strauss Horn Concerto at the "Dvorak 7" concert in March. His performance, like the Triplett's. demonstrated the depth of talent in our orchestra.

Besides the soloists, the three orchestras at NVSO continued to mature and perform at an exceptional level. In November, interviews and auditions were held to search for new directors for the youth ensembles. Though Symphonettes was led by Sujoy Spencer, Marj Sherman and Anne Phelan during the first semester and previous seasons, it was decided that a new, full-time director was needed to advance Symphonettes to new heights. Sujoy, Marj and Anne retired at semester with our sincere thanks, and Caitlin Corbett was appointed as the new director for the second semester. Though Youth Orchestra had been co-directed by Josh Lynch and me in the past, after the interviews and auditions it was decided to appoint Mr. Lynch as the full-time director. Symphonettes and Youth Orchestra continued to provide valuable instruction to over 45 students, which continues to prove that there is a need for orchestral instruction for string students in the north valley. This last season, Symphonettes participated in two end-of-semester youth concerts, and two outreach concerts at local malls during the year. NVSO Youth Orchestra was featured at each of the four main NVSO concerts throughout the season, as well as the same two end-of-semester youth concerts and two outreach concerts with NVSO Symphonettes.

Auditions for the Summerford Violin Concerto Competition were held in January, performing the Accolay Violin Concerto #1 in A Minor, and this year's winner was Jonathan Green. Jonathan was awarded a beautiful hand-crafted violin by Mr. Summerford, and performed on the new instrument at the March and May concerts.

It was decided that the level of expertise required of new Youth Orchestra members was too large a jump from the current Symphonettes structure, and a new orchestra, Youth Strings, was designed and incorporated into NVSO for the upcoming 2017-18 concert season.

The repertoire for the 2016-17 season was incredibly challenging for NVSO musicians, and met with great approval by the community and audience. From the great masterworks of Bach, Beethoven, Brahms, Prokofiev, Strauss and Dvorak, to the current challenges of movies scores by Williams, Silvestri, Newman and Elfman, as well as the little known American composer William Henry Fry, NVSO was again able to provide quality classical music to our audience at an affordable price. I am very honored to work with such a great group of musicians and leaders at NVSO.
